ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNER

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: The work involves performing analysis of environmental resources and participates in the development of planning policies to minimize adverse environmental impact. Duties are performed under general direction. An <u>Environmental Planner</u> does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

- Reviews development proposals to ensure environmental safety;
- Reviews and evaluates subdivision plans, plot maps, sketch plans, and zoning petitions;
- Review maps, aerial photos, data, and field investigation reports and interpret data for planning usage;
- Ensure compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and all federal, state, and local environmental regulations;
- Prepare reports regarding land usage, environmental impact and human impact;
- Participate in committee work for land and resource development, management, and stewardship;
- Manage environmental remediation projects and tasks;
- Prepares written reports and makes oral presentation to various boards and the general public;
- Reviews and prepares environmental assessment forms, impact statements, and other materials related to the environment;
- Meets with developers, engineers, applicants, and board members to discuss environmental issues;
- Advises board members and the general public of how procedures and regulations relating to the environment must be adhered to;
- Keeps abreast of state and local laws and to zoning, planning, and the environment;
- May supervise the work of clerical assistants.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES, AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS: Good knowledge of rural land use planning and development issues; good knowledge of New York State environmental review procedures; good knowledge of the NYS SEQRA Process; ability to interpret and use maps including topographical, soils, and use and aerial photos; ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing; ability to assemble statistical and demographic data from a variety of sources; ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions; ability to prepare written reports; skill in the use of drafting instruments; public speaking aptitude; physical condition sufficient to perform the essential functions of the position.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Possession of a bachelor's degree in environmental studies, biology, geology, environmental planning, civil engineering or a closely related field.

OR

Possession of an associate degree in environmental studies, biology, geology, environmental planning, civil engineering or a closely related field AND two (2) years of experience in environmental planning.

NOTE: Your degree must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. A list of acceptable companies who provide this service can be found on the New York State Civil Service website. You must pay the required evaluation fee.
